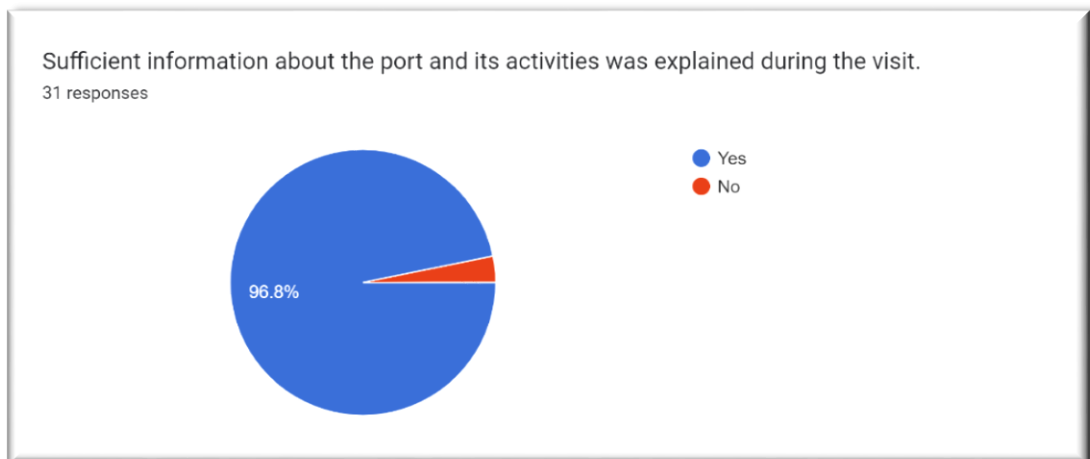
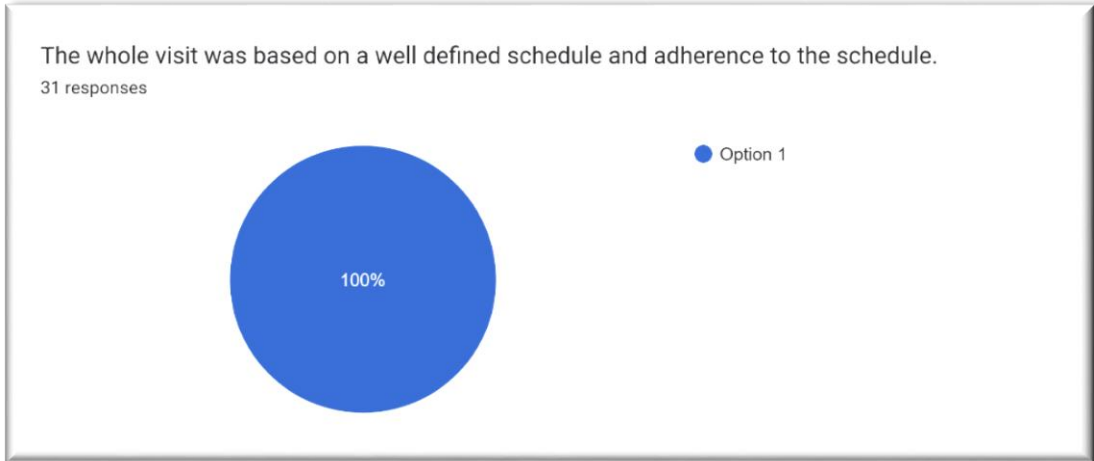
Throughout the visit, Chennai Port Coordinators were enthusiastic in answering the questions of the students and giving necessary information related to the port operations.

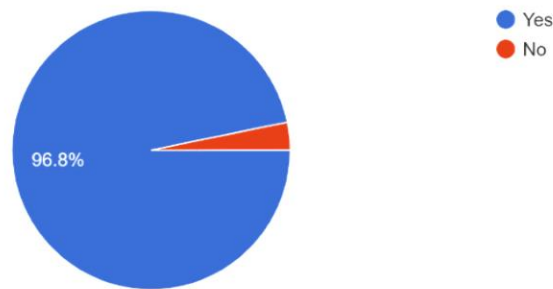
short duration. She mentioned that the department intends to keep this contact with them through internships and future visits.

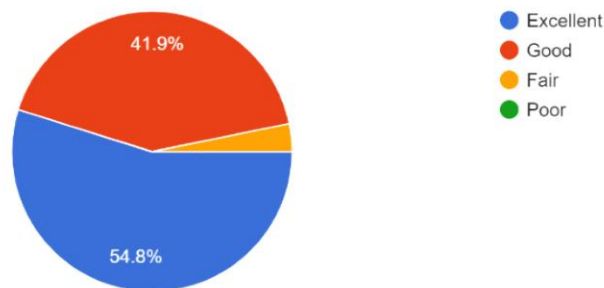
Would you like your department to arrange such industrial visit in the future?
